The following are items for discussion at the August 9 LUC Executive Committee Meeting

Urbana SR 54 Curves Study

TCC Staff gave authorization to proceed on the task order planning study with Burgess and Niple on July 19. B&N staff will conduct a field review of the corridor the week of August 7 and all work is on schedule with an anticipated completion date of August 31.

FY2020-2023 Rural Transportation Improvement Program

The Rural Consultation period for the FY2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program will be held between September 10 and October 12. The Rural Consultation meetings provide an opportunity ODOT, RTPO's, and local officials to discuss their current transportation plans and transportation improvement needs. All local County, Township, City, and Village officials, including engineering, planning, law enforcement, emergency services and transit officials are invited to meet with RTPO and ODOT staff to discuss the upcoming Transportation Improvement Program. The meeting has been scheduled for:

Title VI Plan and Policies Development

TCC Staff has continued development of a Title VI Plan and Policies document for LUC as a FY2019 Planning Work Program deliverable. As a Federal-Aid recipient, LUC is responsible for a program to ensure that the Federal transportation planning process is conducted without discrimination. - John Bayliss asked a question regarding the pollinator. I find many of these areas seeded to wildflowers have as many weeds and many are noxious weeds that are not being taken care of. We think they should take the lead of the control of noxious weeds. I see it all around Logan County. John's comment is not in particular about the pollinator area but the other areas along all the roadways.
